



#### **Spiritual Gifts Inventory**

Christian giving is more than returning a portion of our material resources to God. Just as important are the use of our Spiritual Gifts in service to Christ and His Church. But what are Spiritual Gifts?

#### Spiritual Gifts are:

- Special gifts...
- given by the Holy Spirit...
- to individual Christians for service to the body of Christ.

(Every Christian has at least one and likely more than one!)

#### Spiritual Gifts are NOT:

• the same as natural talents or skills. Talents and skills are given to Christians and non-Christians alike. Talents and skills can also be used to God's glory.

Now that you have taken the questionnaire, the next step is to score it.

After each number place in the box the number corresponding with the answer you gave to that question in the inventory. For example, if under section I your answer to question #1 was a 3 (consistently true of me) then place a 3 in the box next to question #1. Continue this process with each question in each of the 3 sections until all boxes are filled with a number.

Now total the five numbers across for each gift and place that number on the appropriate line after the = sign. Do this for all 17 gifts.

#### **Descriptions of the 17 Spiritual Gifts**

The definition for each of the gifts as well as Scripture references are noted

**Apostle** – (1 Cor. 12:28; Eph. 4:11) apostolos (messenger) This gift allows one to encourage many congregations with the Gospel. Gifted to care for and organize churches; teaching about Christ; directing mission efforts over a larger area.

**Proclamation** – (Rom. 2:6; 1 Cor. 12:10, 12:28; Eph. 4:11) propheteia (forthtelling) This gift allows one to proclaim God's message with certainty and conviction because of an intimate prayer relationship with God. A proclaimer speaks God's word as they communicate divine intention and purposes of God's activities in the world.

**Evangelism** – (Eph. 4:11) euangelistes (bearer of Good News) Christians with this gift share the Good News of salvation through Christ in natural and simple ways that touch people where they most need to experience and hear God's love. Evangelists invite people to believe and trust in Jesus and they often respond not only because of what the evangelist says but also because of their winsome and accepting presence. Christians with this gift have deeply internalized the Gospel.

**Shepherding** – (Eph. 4:11) poimen (shepherding) One with this gift is able to gather people together, demonstrate concern for their struggles, and help they remain close to Jesus. Shepherd look out for those under their care. They model the protective, loving care Jesus has for all of us.

**Teaching**—(Rom. 12:7; 1 Cor. 12:28; Eph. 4:11) didaskalia (teaching) This gift is the ability to clearly explain the Christian faith and equip individuals to apply it in their daily lives. Individuals with this gift communicate with both words and actions. This gift helps children, youth, and adults understand and apply God's Word so that they are empowered for discipleship.

**Encouragement** – (Rom. 12:8) parakalein (encouragement) The gift of encouragement is the ability to inspire, comfort, motivate, strengthen, affirm, and be present with others so they can meet life's challenges with confidence. Those with this gift instill the hope that is ours in Christ in others.

**Wisdom** – (1 Cor. 12:8) sophia (wisdom) Christians with this gift have mature, skillful judgement. They see the ramifications of problems and sift among possible alternatives to find solutions that are in accordance with God's intentions. This gift I the capacity to make Godly choices and encourage others to do likewise. Diplomacy is characteristic of this those with this gift because wisdom involves sorting out problems and issues in the context of relationships.

**Knowledge** – (1 Cor. 12:8) gnosis (knowing) This essence of this gift is having a deep personal relationship with Jesus which allows one to share insights gained from it with others. It is not just head-knowledge but heart-knowledge which allows Christians with this gift to share Jesus in ways that make Him personal and real to others.

**Servanthood** – (Rom. 12:7; 1 Cor. 12:5) diakonia (servanthood) Christians with this gift minister without need for recognition or public affirmation. They are selfless, sacrificial, and loving as they tend to the needs of others and to the church. Those with this gift perform ordinary deeds with extraordinary humility. They have genuine spiritual authority which is based on service.

**Helping** – (1 Cor. 12:28) antilempsis (timely act of rescue, relief, aid) Christians with this gift assist others with practical deeds, especially during critical times. Those with this gift have an enhanced sense of compassion and willingness to tangibly support and assist others in accomplishing a ministry goal. Their helpful deeds in many areas is done out of Christian love which has lasting effect.

**Nurturing Leadership** – (Rom. 12:8) proistanai (lead by sheltering, guiding, modeling) Nurturing leaders guide people where God would have them go and provide protection and support along the way. They promote the well-being and personal growth of those who look to them for leadership. They are dedicated to guiding individuals and watching over them as they grow in faith.

**Visionary Leadership** – (1 Cor. 12:28) kubernesis (visionary and managing leadership) Originally referred to a pilot or helmsman of a ship. This gift particularly includes directing, governing, guiding, and setting a course for a congregation or a ministry group. Those with this gift are

"rudder persons" who help keep congregations or groups on track and focused on their goals. Those with this gift are not dictators but strong leaders who mobilize people to work together for the cause of Christ.

Generosity – (Rom. 12:8) metadidonai (giving or sharing of one's entire self) This gift enables some Christians to share joyfully and passionately what they have and who they are with others. All Christians are to share joyfully of their possessions, time, and Spiritual gifts, but persons with this gift take special pleasure in doing so. This gift is characterized by open-handed, no-strings-attached giving.

Mercy – (Rom. 12:8) eleein (compassion, mercy) Christians with this gift have an exceptional ability to perform acts of kindness and compassion to others. They are touched deeply by human need and respond to others with grace and tangible love and care. They have deep empathy which sweeps aside the need to be concern about whether the one needing care is a worthy recipient. They model Grace.

**Discernment** – (1 Cor. 12:10) diakrisis pneumaton (discernment of spirits) Christians with this gift protect the spiritual health of the body of Christ by distinguishing truth from false teaching, good from evil intentions, and right from wrong actions. They have a unique ability to distinguish between a concerned activist and a destructive antagonist.

**Heroic Faith** – (1 Cor. 12:9) pistis (unshakable trust) Individuals with this gift have an unshakable trust and deep conviction that God faithfully and reliably keeps promises. Christians with this gift become an important example and encouragement for others in the body of Christ. They are often inspirational leaders in the congregation. They encourage others to steadfastly believe in God's faithful promises to hear and answer prayer.

Hospitality – (Luke 10:1-2; 1 Peter 4:9) philoxenos (fond of guests) The special gift whereby the Holy Spirit provides particular Christians with willing hearts, enabling them to cheerfully open their home to others, offering them lodging, food, fellowship and care. Christians with this gift often zero in on welcoming the guest who comes into a congregation's midst.

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace.
